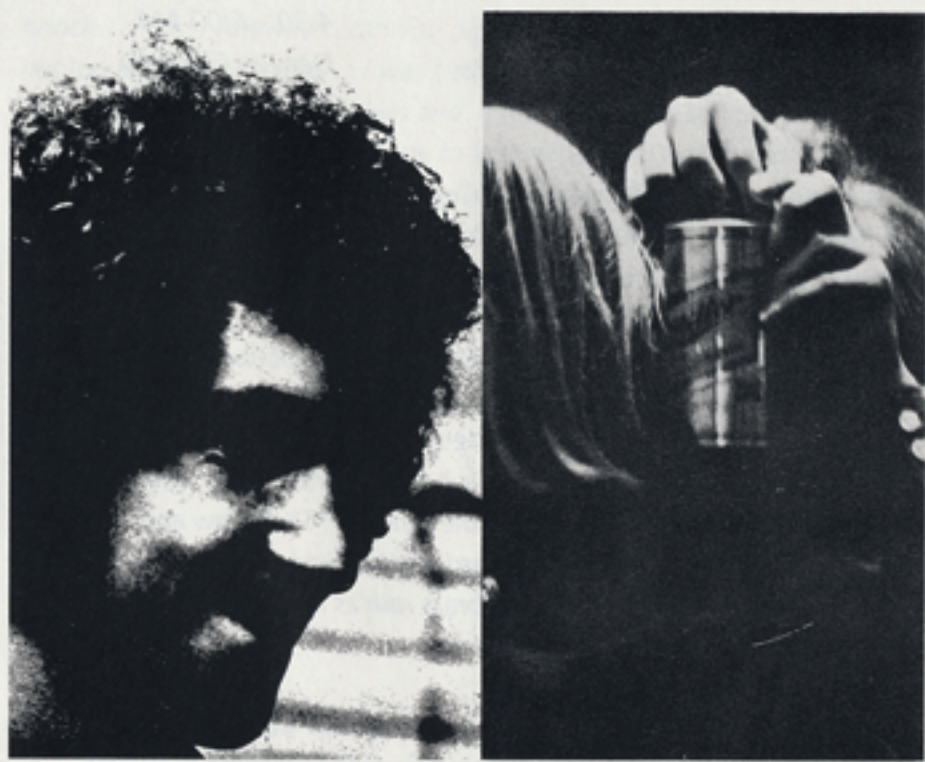

LETTER TO THE ROOM FULL OF MIRRORS


4:30 – 6:00 AM

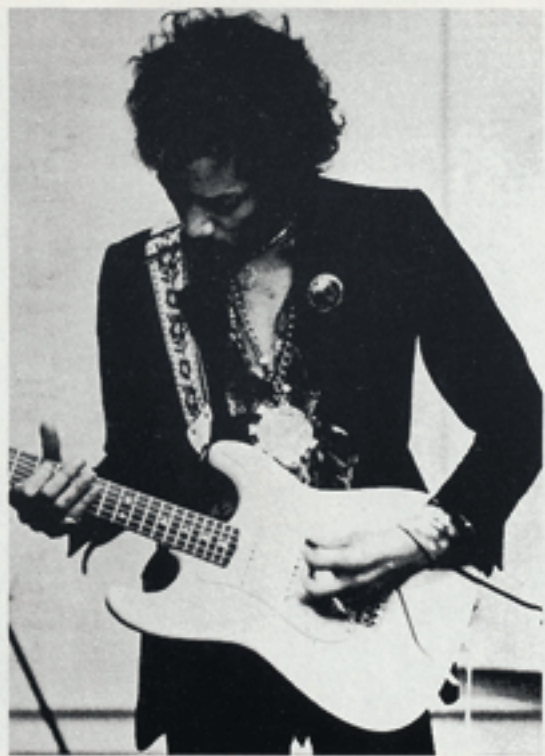

NOTES

One of a handful of certifiable rock & roll masterpieces, *Electric Ladyland* captures completely the electrifying, exuberant genius of Jimi Hendrix. Spread over sixteen cuts, ranging from spacious aural vistas of "1983 . . . (A Merman I Should Turn To Be)" to the blistering intensity of "Crosstown Traffic" to the taut precision of "All Along The Watchtower," Hendrix fully unveils both his endless musical fluency and his astonishing mastery of the electric guitar. Two decades after its release, *Electric Ladyland* is still years ahead of its time.

Following a stint in the Army, Seattle-born Johnny Allen Hendrix served his musical apprenticeship as a backing musician for such luminaries as B.B. King, Jackie Wilson, Sam Cooke, Little Richard, Wilson Pickett and the Isley Brothers. It was in a New York club that he was first spotted by former Animal Chas Chandler, who sold his bass guitars to buy equipment for the young artist.

With Chandler as his manager, Hendrix relocated to London and formed The Jimi Hendrix Experience with bassist Noel Redding and drummer Mitch Mitchell. The trio's first single, "Hey Joe," stormed the British charts in early 1967 and was followed shortly afterwards by Hendrix' groundbreaking debut, *Are You Experienced?* That summer he made his triumphant stateside debut at the Monterey Pop Festival where he upstaged the guitar-smashing Who by setting fire to his Fender. His second album, *Axis: Bold As Love*, was released in January of 1968, as the trio embarked on a major American tour. Booked as a supporting act for the Monkees, Hendrix was thrown off the tour for his outrageous on-stage performance.

Released in September of 1968, *Electric Ladyland* was recorded at the Record Plant in New York and boasts an impressive roster of guest musicians, including Steve Winwood and Al Kooper on keyboards, bassist Jack Cassidy and drummer Buddy Miles. Produced and directed by Hendrix, the double album set features thirteen original compositions, as well as a reworking of Earl King's R&B workout "Come On," the Noel Redding composition "Little Miss Strange" and Dylan's "All Along The Watchtower." With a musical range that stretches from razor-edged rock & roll to eerie avant garde experimentation to deft blues, soul and pop references, *Electric Ladyland* is a tour de force by one of modern music's true originals.
