THE "T-BONE" OF CONTENTION

The vicissitudes of the cattle industry in North Queensland, when the writer arrives, could be used as the frame on which to hang the great Australian story. Cattlemen of the North followed either the explorers, or the miners, or both, on the story of early pastoral ventures and the struggles of the men and women interested in them, is wrapped up and interwoven with the life and adventure of the Northern part of our State. There have been many ups and downs in the industry, and for long years more downs than ups. Chief amongst the early failures was the petering out of the goldfields, fields like The Palmer, Croydon, The Cape, and later Charters Towers and Ravenswood, and the consequent loss of markets. The sudden and devastating appearance of the ticks was, perhaps, the most appalling setback. Then drought, poor markets and consequent low prices for stock, all took toll of the industry, and tested the mettle of the settlers. Later they had to withstand strong Governmental attacks. Knowing "no other hole" they mostly hung on, some perishing by the way. The establishment of meatworks helped to stabilize the price of cattle. The last war meant big money to cattlemen and in this war prices

An indication of the shortage of houses in Townsville area was given in the Court of Petty Sessions on Wednesday afternoon in the case in which H. G. Pass appealed against an order of the City Council that he demolish a certain building. Giving evidence, Mr. W. A. Dean of Brownhill Kirk and Co, stated that at the present time they had a waiting list of 178 names of persons desirous of renting houses or flats in the city. For the past fortnight he had not added any further names to the list, as he considered it would be useless.

Over last week-end steady soaking rain fell throughout the city and also many parts of the North and West. In the city proper, the registration at the residence of Mr. J. H.
