COACH BILLY MacMILLAN

Colorado Rockies announced on June 10, 1980, the appointment of Billy MacMillan as Coach of the Colorado Rockies.

MacMillan, 37, born in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, served as Assistant Coach of the New York Islanders during the 1979-80 season where he and Coach Al Arbour guided the Islanders to a 39W-28L-13T record and a second place finish in the Patrick Division and a first ever Stanley Cup Championship for the franchise.

Prior to this past season, MacMillan served as Coach of the Fort Worth Texans of the Central Hockey League, the Islanders' farm club affiliate. MacMillan coached the Texans for two years and guided the team to Championship during the 1977-78 season and to the semi-finals during the 1978-79 season. It was also during the 1977-78 season, his first year ever as a coach (player-coach during the 77-78 season) that he was selected CHL Coach of the Year.

MacMillan's National Hockey League playing career, 7 years in all, spanning 1970-1977, was spent with Toronto (1970-71, 1971-72), Atlanta (1972-73), and the NY Islanders (1972-73 to 1977-78).

MacMillan is the older brother of Bob MacMillan of the Calgary Flames. He and his wife, Marj, have three children, John, Ann and Susan. They make their off-season residence on Prince Edward Island.

"Patience is the key to success and I feel if the fans and players abide by this, we will develop a winner in due time!" stated MacMillan. He continued, "I am excited with the potential and talent this team has and we shall make things very interesting for the future."

ASSISTANT COACH TERRY HARPER

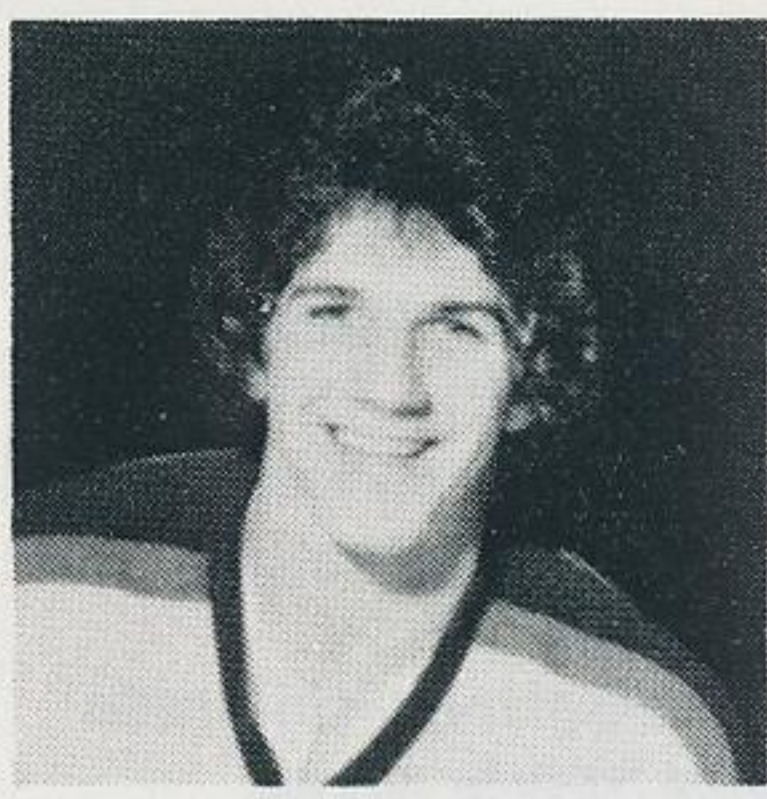
Former National Hockey League All-Star defenseman Terry Harper was appointed Assistant Coach of the Colorado Rockies on September 3, 1980. The announcement was made by Rockies General Manager Ray Miron after a long and extensive search for the right Assistant Coach.

Harper, 40 years old, retired at the end of the last season after 18 seasons in the NHL. A steady defenseman, Harper played on four NHL All-Star teams and spent ten seasons with the Montreal Canadiens (1962-63—1971-72), three seasons with the Los Angeles Kings (1972-73—1974-75), four seasons with the Detroit Red Wings (1975-76—1978-79) and most recently, a half-season with the St. Louis Blues (1979-80). While with the Canadiens Harper played on five Stanley Cup Championship teams.

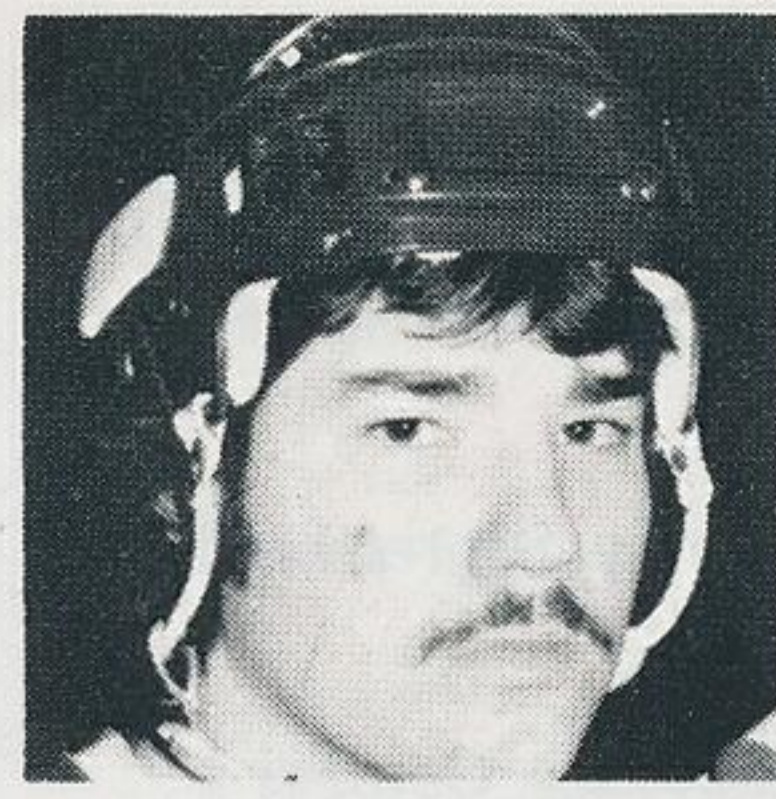
During his playing career in the NHL, Harper developed the reputation as a tough defenseman who patrolled the corners and in front of the net. Harper was also known as the stabilizer who was cool and intelligent and always managed to get the puck out of trouble. While playing with the Kings, Red Wings and Blues, Harper assumed the unofficial role of tutor for the young and inexperienced defense corps that each team had.

Commenting on the appointment Miron said, "We conducted an extensive search for the proper individual who would have the ability to work within the organization, with Billy and the team, and Terry Harper is that person." He continued, "Terry has demonstrated throughout his playing career the ability and patience to work with younger defencemen along with earning their respect, and we expect him to do the same in an official coaching capacity with us."

Harper's responsibilities as an Assistant Coach will be to assist Coach Billy MacMillan on and off the ice as well as work with the Rockies defense corps.

NHL RULE CHANGES FOR THE 1980-81 SEASON

PLAYER CHANGES—In cases when both teams are causing delays with changes, the referee shall give the visiting team a reasonable amount of time to make their change, after which he shall put his hand up, indicating no further change shall be made by the visiting team. At this point, the home team may change immediately. Any attempt to make a change after the signal would draw a bench minor against the visiting team.

STICKS—The length of the shaft has been changed from a maximum 55 inches to 58 inches.

MINOR PENALTIES—When coincident minor penalties are assessed at a time when one team is shorthanded, substitution shall be allowed for the coincident penalties.

FISTICUFFS—When a fight breaks out between two players, other players must go to a designated area away from the fight.

Failure to do so will result in a bench minor penalty to either team or both if they do not do so. In addition, any player, including a goalkeeper, who removes his glove or gloves and/or drops his stick during a fight and who is not a participant in the original altercation, will receive a 10-minute misconduct penalty.

Any individual or individuals who fail to do so would also receive a 10-minute misconduct penalty. This may be increased to a game misconduct penalty if the referee judges that said player is the instigator of the altercation. This penalty is in addition to any other penalty incurred in the same incident. Any player who incurs a second game misconduct penalty under this rule shall be automatically suspended for the next regular season or Playoff game of his team. For each subsequent violation, this automatic suspension shall be increased by one game.

INTERFERENCE—If any player of the attacking side is deliberately standing in the goal crease area, the referee shall immediately stop play and assess a minor penalty for interference.

LEAVING THE PLAYERS' BENCH OR PENALTY BENCH—No player may leave the players' bench or penalty bench for the purpose of starting an altercation. The existing rule provided that no player could leave the benches during an altercation, and this rule still applies in addition to the new addition.

In regular League, exhibition and playoff games, any player who incurs a penalty for being first to leave the players' or penalty bench shall automatically be suspended for the next three games of his team. For each subsequent violation by that player, the automatic suspension shall be increased by three games.

ABUSE OF OFFICIALS AND OTHER MISCONDUCTS—When a player is assessed a misconduct or Game Misconduct after he persists in continuing or attempting to continue the fight or altercation, or resists a Linesman in the discharge of his duties, that player's team will also be assessed a minor penalty.

A minor will also be assessed to a player receiving a misconduct for inciting an opponent into incurring a penalty.

NHL TRAINING CAMP INFORMATION

The National Hockey League's 1980-81 exhibition schedule will allow fans in 44 North American cities and one European site to view the 21 NHL teams in action as they prepare for the League's 64th regular-season schedule which opens Oct. 9.

The exhibition schedule begins Sept. 19, with the Philadelphia Flyers playing the Boston Bruins in Providence, R.I. The final contest of the 99-game schedule will be played Oct. 7, with the Toronto Maple Leafs visiting the Edmonton Oilers.

For the first time in history, NHL teams will participate in a tournament outside of North America as the Washington Capitals and Minnesota North Stars will play in a four-team tournament in Stockholm, Sweden. The other participants will be two of the top teams in the Swedish Elite Division—Djurgardens and AIK.

Five teams—Boston, Buffalo Sabres, Edmonton, New York Islanders and Philadelphia—will play the maximum 11 games during the exhibition period while Quebec Nordiques will play the fewest number of games—four—due to construction of their regular-season facility, the Quebec Colisee.

There are 89 games slated between NHL teams only, while four contests involve NHL and Swedish teams, with five others between NHL clubs and Central Hockey League squads. Victoria Cougars of the Western Junior Hockey League will meet a split squad from the Los Angeles Kings and their CHL affiliate, the Houston Apollos.

The exhibition schedule will also mark the inaugural appearance of the Calgary Flames, previously known as the Atlanta Flames. The Calgary club will play nine contests, six of those in their home province of Alberta.

There will also be six new head coaches behind the benches of their respective teams: Boston—Gerry Cheevers; Buffalo—Roger Neilson; Chicago Black Hawks—Keith Magnuson; Colorado Rockies—Billy MacMillan; Pittsburgh Penguins—Eddie Johnston and Quebec Nordiques—Maurice Filion. Four of those men will be making their NHL debuts as coach—Cheevers, Magnuson, MacMillan and Filion.

The total of 99 games is six fewer than the record 105 pre-season contest played last season. The most active dates on the schedule are Sept. 24, Sept. 27, Oct. 4 and Oct. 5, with eight games slated for each night.
